

> How can we support one another?

Having difficult emotions during a stressful and uncertain period is normal. Keep a look out for some of these signs:

Deliberately avoiding others

Increased irritability, restlessness, agitation, stress and anxiety

Sending or posting moody messages on social media

Talking about death or dying

Reacting differently or gradually losing interest in things they used to like

Eating more than usual or having a much reduced appetite

Sleep pattern changes with difficulty falling asleep or oversleeping

Slowing down of energy levels

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
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Supporting Your Friend

Information For Students on Key Dates for Jan 2025 intake

- All N(A)*/N(T) school leavers are encouraged to submit an application during the 1st Phase (Main Phase) between <u>16 Dec 2024 (2.30pm) to 19 Dec 2024 (5pm)</u>. Application results for the 1st Phase will be released on <u>30 Dec 2024 at 9am</u>.
- If you wish to appeal, please accept the course offered <u>before</u> applying in the 2nd Phase (Late Application/Appeal Phase) between <u>30 Dec 2024 to 3 Jan 2025</u>. The application results for the 2nd Phase will be known on <u>10 Jan 2025 at 9am</u>.
- Unsuccessful applicants can appeal under the 3rd Phase (Final Top-up Phase) between <u>10 Jan to 17 Jan 2025 and 23 Jan to 7 Feb 2025</u> for courses with vacancies. The application results for the 3rd Phase will be known between <u>14 Jan</u> <u>to 23 Jan 2025</u> and <u>23 Jan to 13 Feb 2025</u>.

For Sec 4N(A) and 4N(T) students with **<u>confirmed</u>** ITE EAE offers:

- **<u>must honour</u>** their EAE offers.
- not allowed to apply for Nitec courses or 3-year Higher Nitec courses at the Joint Intake Exercise (JIE).


But, Sec 4NA <u>can still apply</u> for the Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (<u>DPP</u>) after the release of the GCE 'N' Level results, or Polytechnic Foundation Programme (<u>PFP</u>) after the release of the GCE 'O' Level results, <u>if they qualify</u>.

JIE 'N'/JIE 'E' – Joint Intake Exercise

The JIE 'N' is for 2-year *Nitec* or 3-year *Higher Nitec* courses offered by ITE. The JIE 'E' is for GCE N(T) students to apply for the 3-year *Nitec* course with Enhanced *Nitec* Foundation Programme.

If eligible for JIE E, apply for BOTH JIE N and JIE E.



PFP – Polytechnic Foundation Programme

PFP is a one-year programme that offers a practice-oriented curriculum taught by polytechnic lecturers to better prepare polytechnic-bound Secondary 4 N(A) students for entry into selected polytechnic diploma courses. PFP students are given diploma provisional places in programmes, subject to them passing all modules in the one-year programme.

DPP – Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme


DPP allows Secondary 4N(A) students to be admitted directly into selected 2-year Higher Nitec programmes at ITE without having to sit for the O-Level examinations or undergo a Nitec DPP students who programme. successfully complete their Higher Nitec courses at ITE and attain the required qualifying Grade Point Average (GPA) scores are guaranteed a place in a polytechnic diploma course mapped to their Higher Nitec course.

NFP – NAFA Foundation Programme

NFP is a one-year practice-based programme that prepares N(A) Level holders to pursue a diploma in the creative arts. NFP students who successfully complete the programme will be offered a place in their chosen diploma course at NAFA.

DPP – Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme

DPP allows Secondary 4N(A) students to be admitted directly into selected 2-year *Higher Nitec* programmes at ITE without having to sit for the O-Level examinations or undergo a *Nitec* programme. DPP students who successfully complete their *Higher Nitec* courses at ITE and attain the required qualifying Grade Point Average (GPA) scores are guaranteed a place in a polytechnic diploma course mapped to their *Higher Nitec* course.

DPP students who successfully complete their Higher Nitec courses at ITE and attain the required qualifying Grade Point Average (GPA) scores are guaranteed a place in a polytechnic diploma course mapped to their Higher Nitec course.

PFP students are given provisional places in diploma programmes, subject to them passing all modules in the one-year programme.


······ N(A)–Level Student Students who are eligible for and intend to apply for PFP should apply and accept DPP/ JIE N while waiting for O level results.

- Being eligible for PFP <u>does not guarantee placement</u> into a PFP course. Placement in PFP is subject to the availability of vacancies and in open competition with other eligible applicants based on merit.
- Upon release of the GCE O-Level results in Jan 2025,
 - School will contact them to collect the PFP eligibility form (Form P) if they are eligible for PFP after the release of the GCE O-Level results.
 - Students who decide to apply for & accept PFP offer in January will need to withdraw from the DPP course.
 Applicants can apply for a refund of their DPP enrolment fees, subject to ITE's approval.



The 3Rs when deciding on Private Education

Reasons

- Why are you furthering your studies?
- What are the job prospects for your preferred course?

Readiness

- How ready are you to further your studies?
- Can you cope with the academic rigour and assignment deadlines?
- Can you fund your studies?

<u>**R**</u>isks

- Do you know the possible drawbacks?
 - Your expected returns may not exceed the investments you put into your private education.
 - Private schools may make exaggerated claims.
 - Private schools may close due to various reasons.
 - You may not get a full refund if you withdraw from your course.



8 Things You Should **Know Before** You Enrol in **A** Private School

School Registration

Ensure the school is registered with SkillsFuture Singapore (SSG). Review the school's registration period, expiry date and its overall registration track record.

Partner Institution



Research on the partner institution conferring the diploma or degree, and whether the qualification is recognised by the industry.

Is the school EduTrust-certified*? Under the scheme, private schools are assessed for their performance in areas such as school management and provision of student support services.

*Schools are required to obtain EduTrust certification in order to offer external degree programmes



School Premises

Head down to the campus ground to check the facilities and support services. Observe the study environment too.



Fee Protection

Ask if there is any course fee protection so that you will be able to recover unconsumed course fees should the school close down.

Check if the teachers are qualified to teach the course.



Beyond Course fees

Find out about the course syllabus and materials, graduation rates and employment prospects. Approach the alumni to find out what they think of the school.

Internship

If industry attachment is included, find out which organisation you will be attached to, the period of attachment and the alternative arrangement should the attachment become unavailable. Verify the information with the organisation as well.


