

Direct School Admissions



- Application based on talent in sports, CCAs and specific academic areas that may not be demonstrated at the O-Level examinations.
- Refer to respective JC websites (~May onwards)
 - ☐ application period, procedures and selection criteria differ from school to school.
- Inform CCA Teacher/Coach/Instructor of plans
- Meet requirements e.g L1R5 ≤ 20

Joint Admissions Exercise: Affiliation to Catholic JC



- Bonus Points: 2
- Applicable if Catholic Junior College is placed as:
 - ☐ 1st Choice (e.g. Science OR Art stream)
 - ☐ 1st & 2nd Choice (e.g. Science AND Arts stream)
- Note: CJC as only 2nd choice will not grant the bonus.

Joint Admissions Exercise: An overview



- A net ELR2B2 score ≤ 26
- Meet minimum requirements
 - \square E.g. Ngee Ann Poly (Mass Communications) \rightarrow EL \leq B4
- Eligibility ≠ Cut-off point
- Course-placement is merit-based.
- Increasingly competitive
 - ☐ EAE takes up a significant percentage of the intake.
 - ☐ The rest of the cohort to compete during JAE.
 - □ ↑ no. of students choosing polytechnic.

Early Admissions Exercise: An overview



- A way to secure a place in the polytechnic before 'O' Levels.
- Admissions based on aptitude, interest, passion.
- Conditional Offer. Applicants need to meet requirements:
 - ☐ A net ELR2B2 score: ≤ 26 points
 - ☐ Minimum Entry Requirements (MERs) for the polytechnic course offered.
 - □ Failure to meet requirements → EAE revoked → JAE
- Increasing competition: ↑no. of applicants

Early Admissions Exercise: Why EAE?

- A peace of mind
 - ☐ A secured place = Less stressful 'O' Level preparation
- Avoid the competition
 - ☐ Secure a place in a highly competitive course (i.e. low cut-off points) rather than competing with other applicants during JAE.
- Assurance (as long as requirements are met)
 - ☐ Aggregate score > the cut-off point of the course (JAE)
 - □ Place is secured.

Early Admissions Exercise: Why EAE?

SEAN LEE WEI CHUAN

"It was less stressful preparing for the 'O' Levels. Having said that, it did not mean I stopped working hard for my subjects. EAE made it easier for me to enrol in my favourite course. I achieved an L1R4 score of 17 for my 'O' Levels. The cut-off points for my course, however, was 13. This meant that I would not be able to qualify for my course during the JAE. In hindsight, I am glad that I made the time to prepare well for the EAE."

"For me, pursuing Animation was a big step away from what others might see as the more safe option of a Junior College education. Deciding on a polytechnic education and thereafter securing my place in the course with the EAE was of great comfort to me. I knew that, come what may, the polytechnic had a spot reserved for me so long as my 'O' Level results met the minimum requirements. This assurance encouraged me to work towards achieving my personal best for each subject."



- An alternate pathway to a diploma for students who are:
 - □ Not eligible for polytechnic courses (did not meet minimum requirements i.e. fail EL/Math/Science)
 - ☐ Scenario: Student aimed for Temasek Polytechnic's Diploma in Accountancy & Finance, but scored D7 for EL & Math & Science.
 - ☐ Student could consider Higher *Nitec* in Accountancy.

Polytechnic EAE – Polytechnic Early Admissions Exercise

Polytechnic EAE is an aptitude-based admissions exercise that allows students to apply for and receive conditional offers for admission to polytechnics prior to receiving their final grades. It allows students to demonstrate their aptitudes and interests apart from academic grades, thus allowing a wider range of talents to be recognised.

Polytechnic EAE & DSA for Junior Colleges

- Successful applicants will not be eligible for JAE.
- Successful applicants are expected to honour offer.
- They will not see the list of course when they open Form A.
- For students who are unsuccessful, they will need to take part in the JAE to submit their choices.



Conversation Tips: Do's



- © Quality time
 - a Be interested, give them 100% attention, don't rush the conversation
- ☼ Listen more, talk less
 - a Keep the conversation flowing ("Tell me more" ...)
 - a Mix with open-ended questions (too many "Whys" will make them feel like they're being interrogated)
- © Be uplifting, positive and open minded (even if you don't fully agree/support their decision)





- ② Avoid making them lose confidence, have self-doubts or fear in making the "wrong" move
 - "Are you sure there is job prospect?" (Don't show expression of disbelief or doubt. Reframe your mindset & question...)
 - a "How's the job prospect like? Could we find out and discuss more?"
- ② Avoid being judgemental or being critical
- ② Avoid directing or advising (your role is to guide, support & intervene only if it's necessary)
 - "You should ..."
 - a "What about this job that you find interesting? Have you considered other options, e.g. other occupations in the same industry?" 32

Sample questions to narrow down your child's interests & encourage deeper exploration

- "Which would be your top 3 aspirations?"
- "How do you find out more about the career options you have in mind?"
- "That's a job I don't know much about, could you tell me more what it does?"
- "What do you want from this job?"
- "Are there ways you can experience what the job is like?"
- "Are there CCAs or Values-in-Action (VIA) activities that are able to nurture your interests, abilities and passion in this area?"
- "Which courses do you think will lead you to this job?"
- "If you were the one interviewing a new hire for this job, what kind of skills or attributes do you think you will look for?"
- "What plan do you have in mind to work towards this course/career?"

Key Takeaways

Key Takeaways

- There is no right or wrong pathway for your child.
- Every child is unique, so is their pathway.
- Cannot be complacent due to increasing competition
 - Eligibility ≠ cut-off point
 - Not just passes, but quality passes
- Have options, keep them open
 - Plan A, Plan B, Plan C, etc.
- Research, always be informed!
- Journey with your child

Changing mindsets: From...

- "I'll just wait and see. I'll decide when I see my results."
- "I chose JC because I cannot decide which poly course I want."
- "I don't know what I want to study."
- "I don't care."
- "I didn't know I need to pass this subject to qualify".

Changing mindsets: to... >

- "I want to study something related to financial industry. I have shortlisted 3 courses already."
- "I'm good at art so I'm considering Animation. But I'm also thinking about doing Accountancy as I'm interested in learning something new."
- "I definitely need to ensure I pass EL to qualify for the course."
- "I want to learn more about Chemistry at the JC level. If I do well, I want to pursue Chemical Engineering at NUS."
